With a presence in Grants Pass for over 30 years, Pregnancy Care Center (PCC) offers a range of services to pregnant women and their families. Thanks to a generous community of supporters, all services and programs are offered 100% free of charge. In our accredited medical center, anyone who thinks they might be pregnant can receive pregnancy testing, limited ultrasound, consultation with a licensed nurse, and connections to a wealth of local resources.

Expecting moms and dads from all walks of life are also invited to join PCC's Pathways program, which offers two series of hands-on, interactive classes. The first series, "Pregnancy 101," explores topics including pregnancy health, childbirth, newborn care, breastfeeding, and postpartum care with presentations by doctors, nurses, counselors, and other healthcare professionals.

In the second series, "Empowered Parenthood," participants continue to encourage each other, problem-solve the challenges they may face as new parents, and explore topics such as infant brain development, family traditions,

and healthy boundaries. Pathways parents learn about life skills including goal setting, household management, meal planning, and budgeting, so they can make choices that help their families thrive even in the midst of the big life changes that come with bringing a new baby home. 

eople are often surprised when I share with them I never wanted to be a mom. Over the last four years we've said "YES" to over 27 kids in Josephine County foster care system, which on average has 350-450 kids in care. It's amazing how the things that fuel your passion are once the things

that wrecked your childhood. As a survivor of abuse I had a firsthand experience of positive community influence.

Everything about foster care is equal parts good and bad, joy and sorrow, beauty and brokenness. I wanted to shine a light on our journey and what saying "YES" to foster care really looked like in our community and Southern Oregon so I started Geronimo-Project.

Geronimo-Project allows you an inside view of what foster care can look like. From things on why you can't give a child a haircut unless approved by a caseworkers to larger topics of

what reunification looks like. Not all foster journeys are the same so we provide networking opportunities for fosters. We also provide networking opportunities for community members to meet and connect with fosters to see how they can help.

There are minimal resources truly advocating for foster families rights and the children they serve in Oregon. Legally we truly have no rights or final say so to what's best for a child in care. While there are programs that are trying to retain foster parents, many homes in Oregon close due to exhaustion whether

mental or physical. As a community member that's scary to hear. In the United States orphan care is a huge issue but we are privileged not to see orphanages on every corner.

Our hope with Geronimo-Project is to bring change to the foster care system in Oregon and support to foster parents and community programs while sharing our story of redemption and hope in a transparent forum. We want to educate the community in ways they can serve without opening their homes and we want those that say "YES" to foster care know they are seen, heard and appreciated.

Music Helps With That!

usic is innate in all of us. Similar to other activities...anyone can have lots of fun joining in with a baseball game with friends but some people love it so much they dedicate a lot of time to get really good at it.

Music making is a unique activity in that it utilizes many areas of the entire brain at one time. It helps keep the brain sharp as you get older, and when music making begins in early childhood, it even enhances the physical structure of the brain, especially the area that connects the right and left sides of the brain.

Many scientific studies have confirmed this. In an article title, "Thank You for the Music," (available online at https://uq.edu.au/research/impact/stories/thank-you-for-the-music/) one researcher is quoted as saying,

"Findings drawn from data from over 3100 parents indicate that shared music-making at the age of 2–3 years correlates positively with increased school readiness, pro-social skills, and literacy and numeracy outcomes at age 4–5. The results showed benefits over and above shared reading. We found informal music-making to be a powerful tool for early social, emotional and cognitive development."

It's easy to believe that music making has all these benefits when you consider how all encompassing music activities are. Dancing and moving to music involves development of large muscles and balance. Learning to play simple musical instruments helps small muscle development and coordination. Playing music games encourages social development. Learning to sing new songs promotes vocabulary and language development. Singing a lullaby to your child elicits emotional responses and bonding between you and your child.

Here are some practical ways to take advantage of this amazing power of music at home:

Make the transitions between daytime activities easier. Make up a song for bath time, clean-up time, bedtime, etc...Give your child the security of knowing what's coming next and the comfort of the routine. Even if you are certain you can't sing a single note in tune, this in no way negatively impacts your child. Instead it encourages them to believe that anyone can make music and you don't need a fancy back-up band or a CD player to make it happen.

Rock with your child as you sing or listen to music. (They are not too old for this!) Rocking helps them feel the beat with their larger trunk muscles, it also stimulates the vestibular part of the brain which improves balance and coordination and of course gives them that sense of closeness and security we all need.

Start when your little one is a baby. Your child will feel your love and heart as you sing lullabies while massaging your baby after a bath. You'll get giggles and smiles with fingerplays and singing games. Take naps together





listening to soothing music. Dance to music, holding your baby at first and then encouraging their own dancing when they get steady on their feet.

Make music as a family. Enjoy all these activities as a family and let music help you build strong family relationships. My most vivid memories of music in my childhood was during the holidays. Mom, Dad, Aunt, Uncle, brothers and sisters sang carols while baking cookies or preparing dinner or after dinner in the family room. What a family feeling that created! And we weren't all that musical—one of my sisters always had trouble carrying a tune. But we all had fun and the love flowed. . .

My musical childhood may be why I decided to become an early childhood music teacher. When I found the Kindermusik program I was delighted that they develop the weekly class lessons based on the research and tailor all the activities to harness that amazing power of music for your child. Plus they are SO much fun. The days I teach Kindermusik are the best days of the week for me!

A clean chimney will not catch fire

lue fires can be dramatic, and they are definitely destructive. The piping within the chimney—and the chimney itself—will likely be damaged in a flue fire. The worst-case scenario is when a flue fire spreads to the attic, resulting in a house fire.

Take simple steps to prevent a flue fire:

- Have your chimney/flue professionally cleaned and/or inspected annually. If you are new to a home with a chimney, this is a must. Some fire departments—such as ours—loan flue brushes to residents who are do-it-yourselfers.
- Burn dry firewood. Green (or unseasoned) wood leads to creosote buildup in the flue and contributes to air pollution. Creosote is the residue that burns during a flue fire.
 - Always be aware of fire conditions in your woodstove or fireplace.
- When cleaning ashes from your stove or fireplace, remove ashes in a metal bucket, and store the bucket away from combustibles, until cold.

If you suspect a flue fire is occurring, call 911 immediately. Signs of a flue fire are:

- Loud cracking and popping noises;
- Dense smoke (or flames) from chimney;
- An intense, hot smell.

With proper foresight, curling up near a stove or fireplace can be a safe and satisfying experience!

And as always, check often that your fire/smoke alarms are in working order.
